APROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the Tribe of Peroblest Indians have repeatedly in a perfidious Manner acted contrary to their solemn Submission unto His Majesty long since made and frequently renewed;

Habe therefore, at the Delice of the Houle of Representatives, with the Advice of His Wajesty's Council, thought at to issue this Broclamation, and to declare the Penobleot Arive of Indians to be Councies, Revels and Araitors to His Wajesty King GEORGE the Second: And I do hereby require His Wajesty's Subjects of this Province to embrace all Opportunities of pursuing, captivating, killing and descripting all and every of the aforesaid Indians.

AND WHEREAS the General Court of this Province have voted that a Bounty or Incouragement be granted and allowed to be paid out of the Publick Treasury, to the marching Forces that shall have been employed for the Defence of the Eastern and Western Frontiers, from the First to the Twenty-fifth of this Instant November;

Thave thought at to publish the same; and I do hereby promise, That there chall be paid out of the province-Areasury to all and any of the said foices, over and above their Bounty upon Instituent, their Mages and Sublifience, the Premiums of Bounty following, viz.

For every Male Penobscot Indian above the Age of Twelve Years, that shall be taken within the Time aforesaid and brought to Boston, Fifty Pounds.

For every Scalp of a Male Penobscot Indian above the Age aforesaid, brought in as Evidence of their being killed as aforesaid, Forty Pounds.

For every Female Penobscot Indian taken and brought in as aforesaid, and for every Male Indian Prisoner under the Age of Twelve Years, taken and brought in as aforesaid, Twenty-five Pounds.

For every Scalp of such Female Indian or Male Indian under the Age of Twelve Years, that shall be killed and brought in as Evidence of their being killed as aforesaid, Twenty Pounds.

Given at the Council-Chamber in Bestea, this Third Day of Nevember 1 7 5 5, and in the Twenty-ninth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Second, by the Grace of GOD of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, Gr.
